But all in all, you are back on the football bandwagon. You think you're ready for the big kick-off. You've got your shoes,

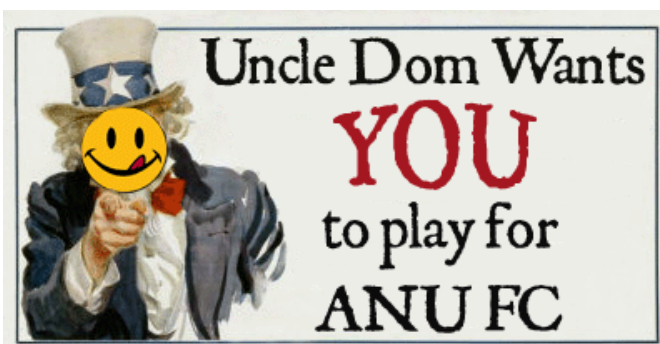

'Six-star' brothel sponsors Australian club

Heidelberg United, who play in Victoria's state league in Melbourne, have fallen on hard times and successfully approached a local brothel for sponsorship.

Gotham City, the South Melbourne brothel, which is described as 'six-star', has also sponsored a senior netball team, motor car racers and kickboxers.

Heidelberg United president, Elias Deliyannis, told the Herald Sun newspaper: 'It's a straight-out cash deal. There are no additional services offered, or asked for.'

Meanwhile, intensive talks are under way in Canberra between senior committee members of ANU FC and Hard Chicks, a local bordello. "We're still trying to iron out the contract," said an ANU FC official. "We want to ensure the club gets the full service."
