### An Important Message From Your Secretary

*Comrades*

Every playing ANU FC member is covered by the Sports Injury Policy taken out by Soccer Canberra on behalf of the majority of the clubs. Previously, our members were covered through the ANU SRA but this is no longer the case for our members playing a sport registered with a state federation (ie. Soccer Canberra) due to higher costs throughout the insurance industry. I can send you the full details of the insurance coverage, however, the following are some important points:

1. The injury must have been incurred while playing, training or travelling with the ANU FC;
2. There are four sections of possible payments: Capital Benefits, Weekly Benefits, Injury Assistance Benefits and Non-Medicare Medical Expenses;
3. Accounts covered by private health insurance will not be reimbursed;
4. Non-medicare Medical Expenses includes physio, chiro, naturopathy, massage and osteopath can be paid up to a limit of \$300 (referral by a medical practitioner is required). The deductible amount is \$100 while the maximum amount to be claimed is 80% reimbursed up to \$1,500;

You can obtain the form off the Soccer Canberra web-site under the organisation/library link ([www.soccercanberra.com.au/library.htm](http://www.soccercanberra.com.au/library.htm)). To make a claim you will need to send the form into the Concord Sports Insurance Agencies within 30 days of the injury and not through Soccer Canberra or the ANU FC. **DO NOT WAIT FOR YOUR ACCOUNTS BEFORE SENDING THE CLAIM.** Please contact me, or any other Committee member, to sign the form as the *club official*, or to assist in any way.
